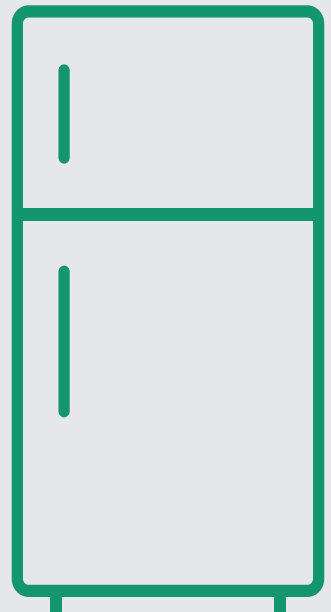

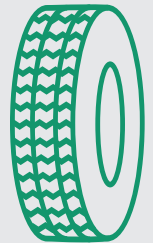

BUSINESSES and FARMS

NEW PROCESS! There is a new hazardous waste vendor in our county, so businesses, churches and farms no longer need to register for the fall Clean Sweep. **DO NOT GO TO THE EVENT. You will be able to schedule a drop-off appointment in Somerset with LRI.**

BUSINESS Qualification:

A business or church qualifies as a Very Small Quantity Generator (VSQG) if it generates less than 220 lbs of waste per month and has less than 2,200 lbs in storage.

The county recommends Logistics Recycling (LRI) as a resource to facilitate proper hazardous waste disposal but does NOT cover costs. Business and church hazardous waste collection is a **fee-based service**.

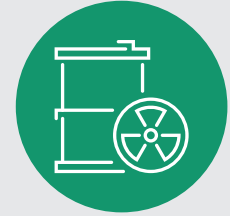
FARM Qualification:

The first 500 pounds are free. You will be charged for additional material. \$5/gallon container for all paints / stains will apply to farms.

Appointments must be made by the end of October (for grant funding).



FREE disposal for St. Croix County Households



- Aerosol cans *
- Brake fluid, carb cleaner
- Degreasers
- Transmission fluid
- Gasoline & lighter fluid
- Oil filters
- Corrosives & lye
- Concrete cleaners (acid) *
- Metal cleaners/polishes *
- Spot removers *
- Oven cleaners *
- Bathroom cleaners *
- Pool chemicals
- Adhesives w/solvents
- Furniture/floor stripper
- Shellac, varnish
- Paint stripper & solvents
- Roofing tar
- Driveway sealant
- Weed killer and fertilizer with weed killer *

LATEX PAINT is not hazardous if solid. Air-dry or mix with sawdust, cat litter or paint hardener until solid. Then place in regular trash.



ALL PAINT AND STAIN Brought to Clean Sweep:
\$5 per 1-gallon or smaller
\$25 per 5-gallon pail

Fees are based on can size, not the volume in the can. Combine can contents of same paint type to save money (ex: combine all latex paint together but don't combine with oil paint).

Do NOT bring to Clean Sweep

These items are NOT hazardous waste and can be recycled / disposed of through other methods

- Appliances and Electronics
- Used Motor Oil and Antifreeze
- Tires and Rechargeable Batteries
- Adhesives and Glues (water-based)
- Caulk, Grout, Putty, Spackle
- Fertilizer without Weed Killer
- Propane Tanks/Explosives
- Sharps, Medical/Biological Waste
- Explosives

YEAR-ROUND Hazardous Waste Collection



If you can't make it to Clean Sweep we have a local vendor who provides a hazardous waste disposal option. Services are available to residents, farms and VSQG (very small quantity generator businesses).

Logistics Recycling in Somerset, WI is certified to manage and dispose of hazardous waste, along with electronics, lamps/ballast, batteries, medical/dental waste, PFAS related waste and document destruction.

A QR code works similarly to barcodes at the supermarket. Each QR code consists of black squares and dots which represent different pieces of information.

How does a QR code work?

As long as your phone or tablet has a camera, it should be able to scan any QR code. Once you've scanned a QR code on your device, the URL pops up on your screen to open or share it.
